Documents that will need to be certified



All documents that have not been sighted by Westpac staff as originals, or are emailed/sent in to Westpac, need to be certified (officially verified) by an official trusted source ('Trusted Referee'). Any documents not in English will need to be translated by an approved translation service provider.

What you and the Trusted Referee need to do.

Instructions: Ensure you use an acceptable certifier.

A person cannot be considered a Trusted Referee if they are:

- Related to the person identified in the identity verification document or the person presenting the identity verification document (for example a Trusted referee cannot be their parent, child, brother, sister, aunt, uncle, or cousin); or
- A spouse or partner of the person identified in the identity verification document or the person presenting the identity verification document; or
- A person who lives at the same address as the person identified in the identity verification document or the person presenting the identity verification document; or
- · A person involved in the transaction or business requiring the certification.

Steps to take:

- 1. Take original of your ID and all other documents to the certifier.
- 2. A Trusted Referee's certification statement must:
 - · Mention that the Trusted Referee has sighted the original document;
 - In the case of Photo ID, make a statement to the effect that the documents provided are a true copy of the original and represents the person seen by the trusted referee; and
 - · Include the following details about the Trusted Referee:
 - Their full name (or initials and surname)
 - Signature (must be a wet-ink signature of the Trusted Referee and not an electronic signature);
 - Their own occupation, confirmation of their status as Trusted Referee (or equivalent), and registration number (if available) with a registering body (e.g., NZ Law Society) and/or confirmation of their status as a Trusted referee and;
 - Date of Certification.
- 3. The certified documents must be securely emailed or posted to Westpac New Zealand within 90 days of being certified.

Note: Audio Visual (e.g., Zoom/Skype) certifications are not acceptable as the original document is not sighted in person by the trusted referee.

Certification wording examples:

"I certify that this is a true and correct copy of the original and represents the true likeness and identity of [x] as sighted by me on [date]. I confirm that I am not a signatory to any of the accounts and have no involvement in the transaction of business requiring this certification".

Approved translation service providers.

The following are approved English translation service providers:

- the issuing Government agency of the identity verification document being translated
- a court in the country of origin if they have been authenticated by that country's embassy or diplomatic post in New Zealand (must be endorsed with the appropriate embassy or diplomatic seal)
- · embassies (if the translation is endorsed with the appropriate embassy seal)
- · language departments of secondary schools or tertiary education institutions
- individuals or organisations who are full and current members of the National Accreditation Authority for Translators and Interpreters. The National Accreditation Authority for Translators and Interpreters Ltd (trading as NAATI) is the national standards and accreditation body for translators and interpreters in Australia. It is the only agency that issues accreditations for practitioners who wish to work as translators in Australia
- The Translation Service (accredited agency for the New Zealand Immigration Service, New Zealand Qualifications Authority, New Zealand Transport Agency and the Citizenship Section at the Department of Internal Affairs).
- Interpreting and Translation Service (private company)
- · MLT Translation Centre (private company)
- · New Zealand Translation Centre Ltd (private company)
- · Pacific International Translations (NZ) Ltd (private company)
- · any other recognised private or official translation service.
